DMII INTERNATIONAL BOARD DRAWS UP 2022-23 ACTION PLANS AND PROGRAMS

The first quarter meeting of the DMII International Board was held via Zoom on January 29, 2022. The meeting's main agenda were the plans and programs of the organization for 2022-23.

International Regent Sis. Sionee Naraga, presiding from typhoon-ravaged Bohol, was able to overcome (through Mama Mary's help perhaps?) the difficulty of internet connectivity and steered the meeting through the discussions in setting up the organization's plans and programs during her term.

January, 2022 saw the resurgence of Covid 19 cases due to the Omicron variant, a highly transmissible strain that saw whole families and households being infected all at the same time. Thus, the planned activities drawn up for the period were still limited by strict health protocols – no face-to-face assemblies - so they will still be virtual.

DMII International Chaplain Fr. Jerome Cruz crafted the year's DMI theme: "The DMII Journeying

SMI ONLINE CHRISTMAS CAROL CONTEST HELD

"Christmas Despite the Pandemic – Tuloy na Tuloy Pa Rin ang Pasko", the fourth quarter SMI theme was re-launched during the last quarter of 2021 and featured an Online C hristmas Carol Contest. The goal of the contest was to showcase and celebrate the talents of the Squirettes as a way to strengthen their resilience and Mary-like positive attitude despite the pandemic.

The contest was announced in early November inviting the Squirettes to send a video group presentation as their circlette's or diocese's entry to be submitted before the big event on December 23, 2021. That gave them over a month to prepare their presentation. The contest organizers provided a list of Christmas songs from which the contestants chose their song The prizes at stake were for the Over-all Best Presentation, Best in Voice Quality, Best in Choreography and Rendition and Best in Props and Costume. The winning groups received cash prizes.

The big event was conducted via Zoom. Program host was Sq. Mary Joy Ancheta, National SMI Vice-President for Luzon. The opening prayer was led by Sq. Elvanne Laynes, SMI National Chancellor. Sq. Elizabeth Urmeneta, SMI National President, in her welcome remarks, said that the pandemic must not weaken our faith, hope and gratitude during the Christmas Season.

An explanation of the contest mechanics opened the contest proper. The entries were arranged alphabetically and grouped in seven batches of five contestants with intermission numbers inserted inbetween each batch.

International Regent Sis. Ruby Macario in her inspirational message underscored the importance that music plays in our lives — as our companion, mode of self-expression, stress reliever and tool to change our world. SMI International Chairperson Sis. Biennah Villanueva presented her with a certificate of appreciation afterwards.

The 3-member contest board of judges were Ms. Lesley Ann Valenn Aldaba who was introduced by

Sis. Evelyn Alcantara, SMI Coordinator for Luzon, Mr. Uzziel Herman Adores by Sis. Ging Manulat, SMI Coordinator for Visayas and Mr. Marlon Balansag by Sis. Annie Ty, SMI Coordinator for Mindanao.

The criteria for judging were Voice Quality, Style and Performance and Over-all Appeal.

While the judges were conferring to determine the winning entries, Sis. Biennah delivered her last message as the outgoing SMI Chairperson. She thanked the Squirettes for their creativity and inspiring commitment to the SMI and to Mama Mary, particularly during the pandemic when their resilience was put to a test. She also thanked the Tita DMIs for giving their full support for all the activities of the Squirettes during the past year such as the Hugot Challenge, SMI Goes Online, and the Face Shield Design-making Contest.







MINDANAO AREA GEARS UP FOR 2022, APFV MISSION PROGRAM SET IN PLACE

Despite the pandemic, we in Regions XII, XIII and XIV comprising the Mindanao Area have already set in place our programs for the DMI Missions.

For Assistance to Prisoners' Families & their Victims (APFV), we conducted our first quarterly meeting via ZOOM last February 12, 2022. I, as Mindanao coordinator of the mission, presided the meeting with 50 sisters in attendance. Gracing the activity was APFV International Chairperson. Sis. Cora Afuang.

At present, prisoners are called PDLs or Persons Deprived of Liberty. Our mission is to assist their families and victims. PDLs are persons who are arrested, held in lawful custody, detained or imprisoned in execution of a lawful sentence because of crimes or infringement or non-compliance with the law, whether they are accused or convicted. They also include persons under custody of certain institutions such as a psychiatric hospital and the like.

The different government agencies handling PDLs are – **BJMP** or Bureau of Jail Management and Penology under the Department of Interior and Local Government which handles inmates of a District or City suspected of a crime committed and under trial; **BUCor** or Bureau of Correction under the Department of Justice which is in charge of custody and rehabilitation of offenders sentenced to serve a term of more than three years or life imprisonment; and the **Parole and Probation Office** for PDLs on probation and ready for release if they pass the probation period.

The distinction between a **jail** and a **prison**: a jail is intended for a short sentence and temporary

confinement while a prison is for felony with a sentence of more than a year.

PDLs may be classified as **Detainees** who are kept in jail, **Inmates** are those confined in cities, municipalities and district detention centers in the BJMP, and **Prisoners** are those confined in a Colony, Federal or State Prison such as the San Ramon Prison Farms, Muntinlupa, Palawan, Davao and others. Parolees are those ready for release with the agreement of good behavior (on probation) supervised by the Parole and Probation Office in every region.

The APFV program may start with a visit to the Barangay Office, BJMP, BUCor and the Parole and Probation Office to identify the PDLs' families and their addresses who will be extended assistance by the DMI circle. Possible assistance to identified beneficiaries may be food assistance, scholarships to the PDL's children in the form of transportation allowance, school supplies, uniform for face-to-face classes, and others, Sulat Mo, Sagot Ko Program, spiritual activities like praying the Rosary, Bible reading/sharing, lectures on acceptance of the crime committed and on forgiving and forgetting, legal assistance if needed and others based on the needs of the families. We will continue observance of Prison Awareness Month held every October, extending special assistance to the families in various ways such as gift-giving, food distribution, etc.

The planned programs and activities for APFV are DOABLE projects that have been undertaken by several circles in the past.

Last December 4, 2021, Fr. Dennis Paez, SDB, vice-dean of the Don Bosco School of Theology

was invited as speaker on "Talk on Family", an advent recollection sponsored by the International Morality in Media Committee chaired by Sis. Cathy Pineda.

Fr. Dennis' talk and video made one feel a variety of emotions that made the DMI participants cry. What started as an ordinary webinar turned out to be filled with realizations: where there is family, there is LOVE and the excitement to be alive to spread the love to our family members once more.

Pope Francis in his "Amoris Laetitia" said that a perfect family does not exist, nor is there a perfect husband or a perfect wife or perfect children. It is just us sinners. "If we learn to say sorry and ask for forgiveness, the family is saved," Fr. Dennis said.

He continued saying that "our families hurt us the most BUT only our families can heal us". For a healthy family, we need the following phrases said frequently:

- "May I?" As parents it would be easier for us to have taught our children to be blindly obedient but it would be best if we develop children who share their thoughts and ideas. The process develops in us patience and results to approval/acceptance of any decision.
- "Please" Saying "please" is important to let



family members know that you are not taking them for granted. It empowers the family member to choose to take action.

- "Thank you" By saying "thank you", you're also saying "I appreciate you", that you are important. It is very powerful that it makes family members more willing to do something for you again in the future.
- "I'm sorry" Apologies re-establishes the dignity for those you hurt.

Apologizing allows you to let family members know you're not proud of what you did. It repairs relationships by getting people talking again, and makes them feel comfortable with each other again.

What a webinar to end the year 2021! After all the crying, everyone wants to hug their loved ones and start working towards making their relationship with family members better than ever.

Love in the family grows as it is forged by the situations which each particular family experiences. In the face of uncertainty, family has the power to energize. In the face of brokenness, family has the power to heal. In the face of despair, family has the power to bring hope.

2022-23 ACTION PLANS AND PROGRAMS FOR THE 5 DMI MISSIONS

Presented hereunder are the suggested programs and activities for 2022-23 by the International Chairpersons of the Five Mission thrusts that can be pursued on the diocesan and circle levels.

1. PRO-LIFE (Sis. Marlin Abratique - Chairperson)

- Celebrate Pro-Life Month in February –
 Eucharistic celebrations, floral offering, candle-lighting and Special Prayer for the Unborn and Aborted Babies before the Tomb of the Unborn in respective parishes
- Conduct webinars on issues and concerns of the family, mental health, care for the environment, etc.
- Celebrate the Foundation Day of the Commission on Human Rights in May by holding an Orientation on Basic Human Rights, Concepts and Principles
- Extend financial assistance to the sick
- Extend "ayuda" to half-way houses for women, children and victims of abuse
- Actively participate in church-related activities such as mass baptisms, weddings, etc
- Conduct/Actively participate in community activities such as medical missions, distribution of health kits, etc

2. MORALITY IN MEDIA (Sis. Biennah Villanueva – Chairperson)

- Enhance media awareness through webinars and talks on "Responsible Media" by speakers from the academe, the religious, etc.
- Orient members and their families on how to deal with negativism in media, especially social media such as bashing, trolls, fake news, etc.
- Strengthen the family and the individual through value formation and developing a Christ-centered life through involvement in church and community-related activities such as participation in Mass, Family Day, etc.
- Understand fully the good and bad effects

- of media, particularly the children and the community
- Network with other media organizations with similar objectives who can promote good media and prevent proliferation of bad media
- Invite credible speakers in the media industry to provide updates/ new trends/others; ex.
 The webinar "How Not to Waste Your Vote" sponsored by the Our Lady of Fatima Bacood Circle

3. UPLIFTMENT OF WOMEN WORKERS (Sis. Lorie Manalansan - Chairperson)

- Promote woman empowerment through:
 - gender equality in the workplace
 - recognition of exceptional mothers having back-breaking and menial jobs
 - celebration of International Women's Month thru Zumba sessions, lecture on self-care, etc.
- Promote health and wellness through:
 - medical missions for women's health concerns such as bone-scanning, Pap smear, etc.
 - Social activities such as celebration of Valentine's Day, Mother's Day, Christmas, etc.
- Provide economic orientation and resources through:
 - Livelihood and skills training through TESDA, etc.
 - Food sufficiency through backyard gardening, etc.
 - Cooking demos/handicraft-making
 - Financial assistance to start a small business
 - Recycling of used materials such as plastic to turn them into new products for home use or for sale
- Provide spiritual development and enrichment activities
 - Participation in Masses as offerors and other roles

- Involvement in church events such as Sunday masses, Lenten Season, etc. including sale of *palaspas*, candles, etc. needed during the occasion
- Religious seminars, recollections, Bible-sharing, etc.
- Partner with/Support other NGOS and organizations with similar objectives
 - Community activities to promote health and wellness such as vaccination campaigns, etc.
 - Partner with NGOs/religious orgs. extending financial assistance to women
 - Support women formerly in the flesh trade

4. ASSISTANCE TO PRISONERS' FAMILIES & THEIR VICTIMS (Sis. Cora Afuang - Chairperson)

- Touch base with prisoners to know their families and victims the Mission's beneficiaries (List may also be sourced from barangays, jail wardens or provincial/city/municipal jails)
- Continue scholarship grants to prisoners'/ victims' children giving tuition fees, school supplies, uniforms, transpo allowance, etc.
- "Sulat Mo, Padala Ko" DMI sisters to help in delivering letters of PDLs to their families especially when communicating with them proves difficult
- Regular visitations to families to extend assistance – moral, spiritual, financial, health care, etc.
- Para-Legal assistance during prisoner's inability to get a lawyer through organizations offering free legal help such as FLAG and others
- Assist the family in finding alternative sources of income – small business, skills training for possible employment
- Arrange free wedding for unwed prisoners or baptism for unbaptized members of the family
- Celebrate with family on special occasions such as Valentine's Day, Mother's Day, Christmas, etc.
- Invite families to join recollections, seminars conducted by the parish and other groups

5. YOUTH WELFARE/SQUIRETTES OF MARY (Sis. Cathy Pineda – Chairperson)

Projects for 1st Quarter

- On-line Novena Holy Rosary prayer for 9 days starting Jan. 16 (Feast of the Sto. Nino) up to Feb. 22 with specific intentions for Tita DMIs, Squirettes and their families for those affected by Covid 19, affected by Typhoon Odette and other personal intentions
- Leadership development Recognition of SMI academic achievers thru a Certificate of Academic Excellence from the DMI circle or SMI circlette. Award may be coordinated with the school personnel (Sample of certificate is available.)
- Knowledge Dissemination Orientation of Lady Counselors/SMI President on their duties and responsibility, pointers on leadership, committees in the SMI, reporting

Getting to Know Your Organization -orientation of new SMI members, refresher for old SMIs Activities:

- Virtual investiture/initiation of new members to the SMI
- Installation of officers
- Chartering of new circlette

For 2nd Quarter

- Virtual mini-Olympics (during vacation or school break)
- Organize virtual gathering for online games
- Invite prospective SMI members to join (a tool for membership recruitment and growth)
- Simple fellowship/bonding in place of face-toface meet-up
- SMI Lady Counselor/Squirettes design simple games, suitable activities such as song contest (Name that Tune), Bible Quiz, Word Puzzle (forming as many words from a root word), Tiktok of the circlette or a team
