DMII BOARD Q1 MEETING, TEAM-BUILDING AND PLANNING WORKSHOP HELD

The DMII International Board's First Quarter Meeting was held together with a Team-Building and Planning Workshop on February 2-3, 2024 amid the peace and quiet of the Antipolo hills.

A cool breeze greeted the participants at the Mary Hill Retreat Center which stands on top of a hill that provides a 360-degree view of the surrounding countryside and the sprawling metropolis of Metro Manila.

During the morning session of Day 1, facilitators from the Bukal ng Tipan Pastoral Care Center, Sisters Ma. Alicia Gutierrez and Joy Candelaria who were lay delegates of Synod 2023 in Rome conducted the getting-to-know-you group exercises. Sisters Aleli and

Joy are based at the St. Joseph Parish in Las Pinas City. Both have spent several years doing parish pastoral work.

The DMII 2023 theme "Growing in Synodality with Mary" keynoted the workshop. There was extensive talk about synodality – walking together on the same path, conversation with the Holy Spirit, synodal intra-ministerial journey, the three synodal pillars: communion, participation and mission, and the transition of the synodal consultations from an event to an experience.

The DMII Vision and Missions were also revisited for a review of the relevance of DMII's current programs and activities in pursuing its missions.

After a short recess for dinner, the group reconvened for the First Quarter Board Meeting during which the events for the year were calendared – the National Officers' Meeting in May, the regional assemblies in the 14 regions, the area conferences in

Annie Ty named the chairpersons and members who will compose the Board's standing committees such as the Executive Committee, and the Committees on Ways and Means, Finance, Audit, Laws and Regulations, Missions and Ceremonials. Nearing midnight, the group called it a day to resume the meeting the following morning.

On Day 2, the participants went back to their respective groups to discuss among themselves their aspirations for the organization and the actions needed to attain them. Out of the groups' outputs, a DMII theme for the year was crafted: "DMII: A Synodal Community with Mary Doing Missions with Inspiration and Integrity". All regional assemblies, area conferences and other DMII official gatherings will carry this theme.

The two-day workshop ended with a Cenacle Prayer led by the sisters from Mindanao and a Holy Mass presided by Fr. Jerome.



Morality in Media

Programs:

- 1. Conduct a national activity, a webinar via Zoom on "Forms and Effects of Media and How to Promote Morality in Media" to be conducted by Rev. Fr. Richard Lagos, a media evangelizer and parish priest of the Shrine of the Holy Face of Jesus of Manoppello, Immaculate Conception Parish, Nampicuan, Nueva Ecija, on April 20, 2024.
- 2. Action Programs for Circles and Dioceses
 - Organize a forum for members to be conducted by a media practitioner/critic or a priest on effects of good and bad media, social netiquette, how to promote positive moral values in social media and how to handle negative posts on social media; e.g. bashing, fake news, trolls, etc.
 - Use available materials on media from Catholic media organizations and other sources (Catholic schools, seminaries, convents) for research and regular distribution of copies to circle members.
 - Create a Facebook page where informative materials related to media and moral values and other related items such as inspirational and motivational articles, pictures and videos

- can be posted. The page can also serve as a tool to communicate with DMI sisters, and for write-ups and photos of circle activities and announcements/advisories.
- Encourage DMI members to become good media warriors through their personal social media accounts and group chats by posting materials similar to those in their circle FB page.
- Encourage the holding of regular Cenacle Prayer by the circle during which activities of the circle for their mission projects, fund-raising and others can be discussed afterwards. Monthly Cenacle Prayers and Bible sharing can also be conducted by Morality in Media Chairpersons in their parishes at the home of a chosen family. if possible in the area of informal settlers and those needing prayer and conversion. sustain the evangelization effort, MIM Mission members must visit the chosen families on a regular basis with values formation and team-building as a culminating activity.
- Organize a symposium or webinar for target groups such as the youth or families in the parish or diocese. A child psychologist or guidance counselor may be invited as resource speaker. Suggested topic: Effects of Media on Families and Communities. The seminar can be brought to schools for the students. Topics to be discussed must be age-appropriate.
- Network with other church organizations, apostolates or other groups (Ex. Parish Formation Council or catechists) that can assist the DMII in promoting good media and in conducting values formation and team-building workshops and promoting the Cenacle prayer to families.
- Partner with a local radio station where programs, whether stand-alone (with a DMI sister as host) or a segment of a regular program (with a DMI as guest) can air DMII Mission activities and other information to promote the organization to its external public.



(Editor's Note: This article on Friendship starts a series about our Values as Daughters of Mary Immaculate.)

One fine day, I got inspired to start a series of articles on the values that are enshrined in the DMII mottos – **friendship**, **unity**, **charity**, **humility**, **sanctity** – in our red handbook that we as Daughters of Mary are invited to grow in.

Let me begin with FRIENDSHIP. This was triggered by a post I saw on YouTube.

The post featured two five-year-old boys who became good friends in kindergarten. Jim is white and Carl is black. But the two told their teacher that they are twins. Of course the teacher did not stop them from doing this. The teacher thought that it is just one of the imaginary tricks of the pair. She, of course, did not tell anything to their mothers.

For one activity, Teacher told the class that twins had to go to school in matching attires. Jim told his mom that for the Twins Day he had to go with the same attire as his twin Carl. The Mom casually told Jim that he has no twin. But Jim cried so hard until the mother agreed to go to school to get the measurement of his twin brother. She also got in touch with the mom of Carl who, she found out, was facing the same problem with her son.

When the two mothers met, and saw the twin, they had the shock of their lives. The boys had nothing in common at all to qualify them as twins. Obviously their sons saw beyond the colors of their skin, beyond the color of their eyes and the texture of their hair. The mothers requested to have a meeting with the teacher to help them understand and handle the situation.

When the teacher asked the boys why they claim they are twins, both of them said the same things: They have the same birthdays, they have the same height and the same eyes. They are the "bestest" friends. The teacher said the boys are inseparable in school and together they help their classmates in class work. They related with each other as though they were real twins, and their classmates took them for their word.

FRIENDSHIP DOES SOMETHING TO OUR SOUL.

So it is true that as kids we first experience friendship before we discover who we are as persons. We learn to trust our friends and find security in their company even before we search for our own identity.

Seeing the two kids in the story made me realize that human nature seems to push us towards somebody else outside of ourselves. Kids do not rationalize why they need friends, they just connect with each other and love the experience. Friendship is like a magnet drawing two persons together.

As adults, we seem to be more whole if we are not just centered in ourselves. We also experience that true joy is doubled when we laugh with a friend; and pain becomes bearable, is halved, when we are able to share it with somebody. Friends lift us up, especially if we can cry with them. And most of all, if we can feel that our friend is a refuge, an ally, kakampi, even protector, then we really feel safe.

No wonder that friendship is one of the values which DMI espouses. Our need to have friends is vital to our existence. And as we approach being older adults, it is crucial for our mental health that we have friends who have been with us for many years.

FRIENDS ARE GIFTS.

How strange that although we are told that we must choose our friends, many times, we don't actually look for them. They are sort of brought into our lives. We have many companions at work, or neighbors, but we click with one or two, or with a few more than with others. And we wonder why. We enjoy each other's company and feel compassion and warmth when we are with them. We don't know but we feel safe with them. As though we can tell them anything, and they don't mind. As though friends are brought to us to listen to us and we are sure that we will not be judged. We feel that we will be accepted as we are.

NOBODY IS PERFECT.

Sometimes they are not perfect. I mean most of the time. But so are we. There are things in them that we do not like, but we still hang around each other. Among friends, honesty is not always the best policy. We sort of hide some things from them about our personal life. Neither do we tell them exactly what we think about their reactions in a meeting. But when we are down and blue, and we do not like to tell anybody why we are feeling low, we call on our friend to spend some time with us so that we can get away from our problem even momentarily. Many times we do not really talk about what is really bothering us. We just need somebody to distract us from our problem. Surprisingly, coffee and donuts with a friend who makes us laugh can also be as therapeutic to the weary soul. A rest for the tired emotions. Our friendship does not always need to lead us to pray the rosary together or to discuss the handbook. There are projects to plan, and activities to propose, but many times we do not call on our friends for these. We just need company. And laughter.

WHEN SOME FRIENDS BETRAY US

But what if a friend betrays us? Talks behind our back and tell other people about our secrets? Or spreads lies about us? Of course that hurts. That breaks our heart and soul. For it is not only our reputation that is tarnished, not only our name and honor that are degraded. It is our trust and our friendship that are broken. It is our intimacy that is violated.

How do we move on from such betrayal? Just think that it is not our name that was maligned. It is her own dignity that was put into question. People will see her as a traitor. And you, what do you do? If you go on joining the others despite the betrayal, people will learn from you how to handle being betrayed gracefully. Tell yourself that your happiness and your dignity can never be destroyed by anybody. It is only when they see in you the bad things that she spread about you, that people will judge you. Otherwise, ignore your discomfort. People will forget those

gossips. And if they see you continuing to be committed and dedicated, the gossip will be forgotten. Sometimes, silence can really be golden.

And do you realize that if a true friend does it, we really do not get angry at him or her. It is more tampo that we feel. So, after some time, it goes away.

FRIENDSHIP NEEDS INVESTMENT TO GROW

Friendship is a treasure that needs care and attention. Just as a garden needs water and sunlight for the flowers to grow, we need to invest in friendship, too. We should dedicate time, energy, attention to our friends. Getting in touch with them is crucial. Being connected is important. This needs time and effort, of course. Either you text, or do face time, or even email. Sometimes you meet up and spend an afternoon as often as schedules allow it.

After her funeral, stories came out about how Queen Elizabeth kept her feet on the ground and her heart in love with her family. It is reported that despite her busy schedule, she never missed tea time with some of her trusted relatives. She was faithful to them who keep her company. No wonder she maintained her wit, her humor, her sensitivity and mental agility to the hilt.

WE NEED FRIENDS FOR OUR MENTAL HEALTH

These last years, we keep hearing about the importance of taking care of our mental health. Because of the current state of our world, we find ourselves subjected to a lot of stressful situations and many people go through depression, anxiety and social interaction difficulties. One recommendation of experts is being with friends, talking with them even about nonsense. This interaction keeps our positive energies bubbling. For as long as we do not talk about lies and negative things about other people, talking enables us to connect with our innermost thoughts and feelings. Getting in touch with what goes on inside us and being able to express it to somebody makes us whole. It makes us understand ourselves and brings us peace. Most important of all, it connects us to others. It makes us feel that we are not alone. And this keeps our positive energy flowing.

HOW MANY FRIENDS TO HAVE?

And how many friends do we have? Acquaintances, we have plenty. And it is good to recognize people when you meet them. But it is not necessary that we be friends with many. We cannot maintain a lot. A small group of solid, loyal, lasting, faithful sincere friends is enough. Remember the dialogue between St. Teresa of Avila and Jesus? Once Teresa was complaining to Jesus why she undergoes many sufferings. Jesus said: That is how I treat my friends. And Teresa replied: No wonder you have very few friends.

At the heart of our DMI spirituality is our ability to enter into friendship and maintain them. This is an opportunity to give and receive love which is a gift from our God. So, friends do take us to our dear God.
