After more than two years of restricted movements around the country due to the pandemic, DMII circles all over the country were once again able to fully celebrate International Women's Month in March, 2022.

Public awareness of the month-long celebration was done through tarpaulins put up in parish church courtyards and other public places with the year's

theme: "Gender Equality Today for a Sustainable Tomorrow". The theme was aligned to that of the United Nations Women Organization's call for empowerment. The tarp's design, while similar to that of the UNWO's, featured Filipino women, DMI sisters at that. level mostly on International Women's Day on March 8 but also on other days of March.

In Region I., the Our Lady of Grace Circle in the Diocese of Laoag tansformed a dump site into a mini-park inside the parish grounds of San Nicolas de Tolentino Church in Laoag City. (Please see related story on page 7.) The Diocese of Baguio's St. Vincent Ferrer Circle conducted a "Clean and Green Project" at the San Pablo Seminary.

Many circles adopted urban and vegetable gardening as a response to food shortages during the pandemic and a 'looming' food crisis on account of economic difficulties that the country and the rest of the world are experiencing now.

Health and wellness via zumba sessions and medical missions were also popular activities by many circles. In Region IV (Diocese of Malolos), the Holy Child of Parada Circle even gave out Health Cards to mothers who are solo parents together with a pack of groceries.

Many circles also sponsored webinars and talks with such themes as -

"Gender Equality Today for a Sustainable Tomorrow" by the Sto. Nino de Molino Circle of the Diocese of Imus (Region V), and in Region VIII by the Our Lady of Fatima jointly with the Sta. Maria Goretti and the Little Flower Circles of the Diocese of Caceres;

Gender Sensitivity and Violence Against Women by the Our Lady of Fatima Circle in Region VII;

Women's Rights by the Mater Admirabilis Circle of the Diocese of Urdaneta (Region II);

Symposium on Women's Rights and Laws by the Queen of Divine Grace Circle, Diocese of Agusan del Sur (Region XII);

In Region V, Eco-Gardening and The Role of Women in Community Nutrition by the Diocese of Manila and The Role of Women in the Church by the Our Mother of Perpetual Help Circle, Diocese of Imus. In addition, livelihood projects on food preparation, handicrafts as well as education on Woman Empowerment were conducted by the Our Lady of the Rose and Divine Love Circles of the Diocese of Manila. The circles supported indigent girls to ensure that they grow up empowered and provided a good future.

Region XIV meanwhile, conducted an Archdiocesan-wide webinar on "Women: Providing Healing and Promoting Hope". The sisters also participated actively in their LGU's celebration of International Women's Month.

Awards of Recognition were likewise given to dedicated DMI sisters who raised generations of DMIs and SMIs in their family, notably Sis. Iluminada Sioson of the Divina Pastora Circle, Diocese of Cabanatuan in Region II and Sis. Reden Lumanog of the Immaculate Conception Circle, Diocese of Iba in Region III.

In Region V, the Our Lady Queen of Peace Circle, Diocese of Imus celebrated and recognized women achievers in fields where "the bar was raised and stereotypes broken to forge women equality". These achievers include Capt. Maxine Yongoyong, a pilot; Twinkle Monera an avionics personnel; Renita Mondano, a van-for-hire driver and Maribeth Ostria, a tricycle driver.

Fund-raising and donation drives were also held to fund the projects not only of the Upliftment of Women Workers Mission but for the other DMI Missions as well. For Upliftment of Women Workers, the funds raised were used to finance small and start-up businesses of DMI beneficiaries.

The successful nationwide celebration of International Women's Month underscored the importance of empowered women which the country urgently needs in these hard economic times. "Every woman's success should be an inspiration to another." We're strongest when we cheer each other on. A toast to the great women that the DMI sisters are!

Rev. Fr. Danilo Devaras and Rev. Fr. Richmond Carl Balicoco, the newly-appointed moderator and member of the Team Ministry, respectively of the Diocesan Shrine and Parish of San Nicolas de Tolentino. San Nicolas, Ilocos Norte went around the vicinity of the church a day after their arrival. They noted with praise some parts of the church surroundings as well as those that need improvement such as the northern part below the bell tower where there was a massive pile of of trash almost the height of the gate. The Eucharistic Lay Ministers of the church were tasked to remove the trash.

Two months later, the Our Lady of Grace Circle headed by Regent Sis. Lenie Pumaras Datoc and Vicarial Regent Sis. Eufemia Resurreccion with the help of the Knights of Columbus headed by Grand Knight Nanding Raquel were delegated to address the same problem.

Seeking the assistance of the municipal government through Environment and Natural Resources Officer Ms. Marilyn Tolentino, Operation Linis was launched. On January 13, 2022, the clean-up drive was started with the help of other government offices – the PNP, BFP personnel and volunteers from the San Nicolas de Tolentino Parish. The clean-up continued for nine consecutive Saturdays by the Parish Youth Council, altar boys and others.

The dumpsite has now become a mini-park with benevolent donors, parishioners and friends donating truck loads of gravel and cemented garden sets in time for the celebration of International Women's Month. The project is also an activity of the circle's Pro-Life Mission on care for the environment.

The mini-park is expected to be completed before the celebration of the feast day of their patron saint, St. Nicholas de Tolentino.

A tribute to the Blessed Mother as Mother of All Nations came next with the recitation of the 2000 Hail Marys and offering of flowers and candles on her altar.



She also invited everyone to join Pope Francis as he consecrates Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on March 25 to achieve world peace.

Sis. Sonia introduced the guest speaker, Bro. Vic Pestano, a much-sought-after speaker and Catholic lay evangelist. Currently, Bro. Vic is a member of the Council of Advisers of the Oasis of Love Catholic Renewal Community and a former formator of the Basilica of the Black Nazarene in Quiapo and Minor Basilica and National Shrine of St. Lorenzo Ruiz in Binondo, both in Manila.

In his talk, Bro. Vic cites Lent as a season that happens in spring. This is symbolic because it follows winter which spells "lack of life". Lent, like spring, is a time for us to change for the better as we are reminded of a new life because of God's unconditional love by allowing Jesus Christ to die on the Cross so that we may be saved.

With this, we can view our observance of the Lenten Season as a time of Hope. And with hope comes expectation or fulfillment of something positive.. We are reminded that trials are for good because they help us develop endurance. And endurance develops strength of character. And brings about HOPE in God. If we hope in God, we will never be disappointed. Before we can have hope, though, one must have faith, then hope and love, in that order.

As Hebrews 11:1 cites: "Faith shows the reality of what we hope for; it is the evidence of things we cannot see." When we put our faith in God, He becomes our Hope. Isaiah 40:31 mentions that "... those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint ..."

Hope is developed when we:

- 1. Seek the Heart of God in prayer and spend time in His Words. In so doing, we are able to trust in His promises.
- 2. Hope requires that we **be patient in waiting** and while doing so,
- **3. Listen to the wisdom of others** who made it through tough times.
- 4. It also helps that we recall what God has done for us in the past and realize that He always has a plan and is in control. From here we realize that "God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love Him,"
- 5. Then, we can **expect the turn-around . . .** the answer to our prayers.

In ending his talk, Bro. Vic cited Romans 15:13: "May the God of hope fill you all with the joy and peace as you trust Him, so that you may overflow with HOPE by the power of the Holy Spirit."

On March 8, 2020, Sis. Nerissa Estores of Wao, Lanao del Sur was elected as the first DR outside of Bukidnon. :(Leadership in the diocese had shifted from Valencia City to Malaybalay City and Manolo Fortich, all in Bukidnon.) However, because of the pandemic lockdowns, Sis. Nerissa was not able to perform her duties as DR. With the resumption of most diocesan activities under Alert Level I in 2022, the DMI sisters of Wao requested for a Bukidnon-based DR due to distance and other concerns.

Sis. Edith Joromat has now formally taken over as DR of the Diocese of Malaybalay.

Under her leadership, the diocesan officers are now ready to resume DMI activities under a new normal environment.








