

4th SMI Luzon Area Conference

After years of using virtual technology, the Squirettes of Mary Immaculate finally held its 4th face-to-face Luzon Area Conference last July 22 - 23, 2023 at Ion Hotel, Baguio City with a theme:

SMI: One in Mission Towards a Synodal Church with Mary

Sub-theme: Appreciating our Filipino Culture Amidst Digital / Social Media World as we Strengthen our Faith to Greater Heights

This conference was attended by a total of 385 SMI and DMII delegates from 7 regions of the Luzon Area with a total number of 51 circlettes. The conference officially started with the enthronement as the image of the Blessed Virgin Mary was carried to Her altar by DMII International Chaplain, Rev. Fr. Jerome Cruz and SMI National President, Sq. Elizabeth Urmeneta. The enthronement was followed by the SMI prayer, parade of colors, singing of the National Anthem and Pledge to the Flag which were all done by selected Squirette delegates. The presentation of Circlettes happened right after the enthronement and consecration rites with each circlette's president carrying her circlette banner.

The opening ceremony was capped with the singing of the SMI Hymm.

Tagaytay last July 2022 there was mention that the youth are whom we need today. They are the "sleeping giant " that we need to evangelize. So that if we do our role in fulfilling the objectives of our Youth Welfare Mission, the DMII/SMI become more relevant in our Church.

One way to evangelize and bring the youth to Church is to let them live actively the liturgical calendar of the church (there are the New Year, Lent Season, Mayflower Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, September birth month of Mama Mary, October rosary devotion, Feast of Christ the King end of the Liturgical year then Advent or Christmas season, and involve them as we can in the Feast Days of our Patron Saints which is all year round.

Let our youth enlist as regular church servers (every Sunday as lectors/commentators, choir, altar servers/ sakristans, social communications/IT/mass livestreamers -just to name a few tasks). Being so, brings their sense of commitment to a higher level – a commitment to a commitment of being a regular church server.

As all previous conferences the SMI had before, this conference cannot be completed without the Marian Talk. The SMI Area Coordinator for Luzon, Sis. Chodee

Amoranto, introduced the guest speaker for this year's conference. The Marian Talk was given by Rev. Fr. James Dexter R. Tanguis of the Order of the Augustinian Recoletos (AOR).

He discussed the main theme of the conference: SMI: One in Mission Towards a Synodal Church with Mary as well as the Dogmatic Titles of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Dexter emphasized that this year's teambuilding activity is made not only for the sake of competition but to build camaraderie and socialization among the Squirettes. The activity was ended by the signal song "Girl in the Mirror " that was enthusiastically danced by all squirettes.

Chodee Amoranto, the Luzon Area Coordinator as the DMII Comelec. Sq. Joy Ancheta from Theresian Circlette, Diocese of San Pablo, Region 6 won the position of National Vice President for the Luzon Area. Two nominees from Luzon with the most votes for the positions of National Secretary, National Treasurer and National Chancellor will compete with the top 2 nominees for said positions from Visayas and Mindanao during an online elections to be held in August when all the resumes of the candidates shall have been collated.

The Tita DMIs had their own activities simultaneous with the SMI's teambuilding activity. They had flower arrangement lessons and Baguio peanut-brittle making and tasting. The Titas were also given a chance to make friends with one another thru the game Human BINGO that made them go around to get to know who the persons being described in the bingo boxes are.
